There was no Luce in the 1838 Arichat census, however there was a Nicolle family. The earliest Isle Madame record of this family is the baptism of Esther's first child in 1831. The later marriages of Moses and John suggest they moved to Isle Madame some time after Esther.

The 1841 Jersey census has a Luce family in St. Peter's parish, Vingtaine of St. Nicolas, living in Beaumont Village:

Esther Luce lived in St. Peter, Jersey at the time of her marriage. Her marriage record cited her parents as "Moise Luce and Anne Williams" who were married 8-19-1802 at St. Lawrence. Her godparents were Wm Telland and wife Esther Luce. Her parents had seven more children (all males) including a Moise Luce baptized Feb 1810 and a Jean Luce baptized May 1813. This evidence makes it seem likely that Esther was indeed the sister of Moses and John Luce.

Cited in 1838 census as Nicholle with six children.

Cited in 1-1852 Protestant census as Esther Luce Nicolle (44), John Nicolle (43, tailor), John Nicolle (21), Ann? Luce (19), Mary Ann (17), Peter (15), Philip (13), Eliza (11), Esther (9), Ellen (7).

Cited in 1861 census in Little Arichat as 5 males and 4 females.

Cited in 1871 census as John Nicole (62, b. Jersey), Esther (62, b. Jersey), Philip (30, b. NS), Henry G. (17), Jane (36, b. NS with Guernsey ancestry, this is Jane LeLacheur), John (14), Peter G. (12), Charles (9), Esther J. (6), and Henry W. (3). This seems to be two families: (1) Esther Luce and John Nicolle and (2) John George Nicolle and Jane LeLacheur. Several households cited in 1881census living in West Arichat.

 John Nicole, 75, widower, fisherman, born Channel Islands. This is the husband of Esther Luce.

(2) Henry W. Nicole (28) and Suphronie Nicole (16, Scottish, born NS). This is a son of John and Jane, and Esther's grandchild.

(3) Jeane Nicole (44), John (24), . . . This family is that of John George Nicolle (likely dead) and Jane LeLacheuer.

Husband John Nicolle was born abt. 1809 in St. Mary's Parish, Jersey. He died 1-10-1884 in Arichat age 75, buried 1-12-1884 SJA. On 2-3-3013 I found a baptism record in St. Mary's Parish for Jean Nicolle, 2-20-1809, son of Anne Marett. He is named "Jean" in his marriage record to Esther Luce.

John Nicolle was one of the three people to sign an oath swearing the accuracy of the 1838 census that appeared at the end of the Arichat Census records. To Mark Nicolle, a correspondent of mine, it appeared that names in the census were written in hand writing VERY similar to John's signature. Also, John and Esther's names were the very first on the list recorded for Arichat, and whoever wrote their names just happened to write those two names much darker and more clearly than the other names on the list.

Cited in 1871 census as living in Petit de Grat: Moses (68), Zabine (50), Daniel (20), Deserea (14), and Isiah (12).

Cired in 1881 census living in Petit de Grat: Mauzeise Luce (71, born Jersey) head, wife Zabine (45), and children Desira (21) and Esies (20).

Cited in 1901 census as living in Petit de Grat: Desire Luce (45, b. 5-5-1855) as head and only family member.

Wife Sabine Fougere was born abt. 1816 in Nova Scotia. She died 6-26-1883 and was buried at Notre Dame de l'Assomption Church, Arichat, NS. Parents: Joseph Hilarion Fougere (1773–1843) and Adelaide Forest (1788–1858).

Between 1844 and 1875 John Luce was a tailor in Rocky Bay, per children's baptism records. Cited in 1852 Protestant census as John Luce (39, tailor), Sarah Wilson Luce (32), James Amie (14), Catherine Amie (12), John Luce (8), Elizabeth Luce (1).

Cited in 1861 census in Richmond County, Polling District 2 (Petit de Grat), with 4 males and 6 females (or 5 and 7!).

Cited in 1871 census living in Petit de Grat: John Luce (55, born in Jersey, widowed), John Luce (23), Sarah A. Luce (20), and Margaret Luce (18).

Cited in 1881 census living in Petit de Grat: John Luce (66) with son John and his family.

¹ It is not uncommon for death records to err regarding the age and parents of the deceased. After all, the person who is sure to know the truth is not available.

Wife Eleanor Sarah (Wilson) Amey was born 1820 Arichat. Died 1864 at age 44, likely from childbirth, buried 2-18-1864 St John's Anglican Church, Arichat. She first married Philip Amey on 2-6-1837 in St. John's Anglican Church, Arichat. Philip died 6-27-1840, age 26, in Little Hants of scarlet fever.

Cited in 1871 census; see entry for Esther Luce and John Nicolle. There were Jane (36) and children John (14), Peter G. (12), Charles (9), Esther J. (6), and Henry W. (3). John George Nicolle is absent, he would have been 40.

Cited in 1881 census living in West Arichat as Jeanne Nicole (44, widow), John Nicole (24), Peter Nicole (22), Charles Nicole (17), Esther Nicole (16), William Nicole (14). It is my guess that Jeanne is Jane LeLacheur. This family lived next door to Mary Ann (Nicolle) and Alexander George. There was a second family: Henry W. Nicolle (28), and Suphrenie Nicole (16, Scottish, born NS); this is a son of John and Jane.

Cited in 1911 census living in Janvrin's Harbour as John Nicolle (53, b. 1-1859), Louisa (47, b. 12-1863), Everette (20, b. 12-1890), Stanley (17, b. 4-1894), and Jane Eva (76, b. 3-1835). Jane Eva must have been Jane LeLacheur. This is the family of John William Nicolle and Judith Louisa LeLacheur. [This census is notorious at getting the birth dates wrong.]

Based on the census, it appears John George Nicolle died between 1868 and 1871.

Jane LeLacheur was born 3-26-1834 in West Arichat to Perer LeLacheur and Jane L'Heureaux.

Philip Nicolle (1839-) and Judith Jane George (1854-)

Wife Judy Jane George was born 3-22-1854 on Isle Madame, baptized 12-15-1854 St. John's Anglican Church, Arichat. Parents: Martin and Abigail Eliza George.² Martin and Abigail Eliza George cited in 1852 Protestant census as Martin (43), Abigail (38), Alexander (17), Christopher (15), and Enias Charles (2). Her brothers Alexander and Christopher married Philip Nicolle's sisters. The George family was cited in the 1871 census as Dutch. The first St. John's Anglican Church, Arichat record is the 1861 marriage. Perhaps the family immigrated intact. Abigail George was buried 4-1-1876 St. John's Anglican Church, Arichat.

Mary Elizabeth Nicolle, b. 4-1-1871 Janvrin Island; m. 1-23-1892 Henry William LeLacheur in Arichat; d. 8-27-1954 in Martinique, Isle Madame. I do not know her parents, but as there seems to have been only one Nicolle family, she was likely a daughter of Philip Nicolle.

She had sisters Eva, Alice, May and brothers Jimmy, Charles, Joseph. This woman is likely the Marie Luce who was born 12-20-1902, but I cannot be sure.

Sara Fougere was the daughter of Felix Fougere and Adele Boudrot. She died 5-17-1915 age 45, buried 5-19-1915 Notre Dame de l'Assomption Church, Arichat, NS.

A John Luce immigrated to the Cape Breton colony soon after it was founded in 1784 and, in time, settled in Arichat, where he became a merchant, justice of the peace, and captain of the militia. His talents also ran to land and road surveying, in which he became somewhat accomplished, so much so that after the annexation in 1820 the Halifax authorities saw him as an exception to the run of Cape Breton surveyors. The name John Luce & Co. appears on a list of grants issued during the administration of William Macarmick, Lt. Governor from 1784 to 1794. In 1804 he was granted 100 acres of land at the Gut of Canso. (*Journey Through a Cape Breton County: Pioneer Roads in Richmond County* By Arthur J. Stone, 1991)

I believe this John Luce was the one died of apoplexy, age 62 and was buried 2-1-1840 in Arichat. He was thought by some to be the paterfamilias of this family.

A ship's manifest dated 10-19-1839 for the 65-ton Schooner *Intended* owned by Peter DeCarteret bound from Arichat to Philadelphia and Baltimore: John Luce, age 55, male, merchant, belonging to Arichat, CB, intending to inhabit Arichat, CB, with one trunk.

In 1812 a John Luce, wrote *Narrative of a Passage From the Island of Cape Breton Across the Atlantic Ocean, With Other Interesting Occurrences, in a letter to a friend* about a voyage that occurred in the winter of 1799.

Philip Mauger Luce, son of John Luce, manager for the Robin firm, later settled at Riveire aux Renards (Fox River), Gaspe, Quebec. (*The Quiet Adventurers in Canada* by Marion G. Turk, 1979)

There are Cape Breton land petitions citing Luce:

- 1803 Luce, John & others: Petition to Despard: Petitioners ask an allotment of land south of Ship Harbour Point on the Gut of Canso [now called Point Tupper]. John Luce, William Luce and Robert Buckmaster.
- 1810 Landrie, Charles: Petition to Nepean: Petitioner was born in New Brunswick, has lived thirty years in Arichat. He is now seventy years old, has nine children, seven of whom are in C.B. He asks a grant of the land on which he has long lived, and which adjoins land granted to Robin Luce & Co.
- 1810 Luce, William: Petition to Nepean: Petitioner is a British born subject, and has lived the past eight years in Cape Breton. He asks 200 acres of land adjoining the lot of his brother on the Gut of Canso. Note: complied with.
