

# Philip Cyrus Dorey Family Details by Susan J. Dorey

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In this document and the accompanying diagrams, each person has an assigned ID. The ID is a segmented number where each segment is separated by a period. The number of segments indicates the generation. For example, 1.2.3 is the third child of 1.2 who is the second child of 1.0. Spouses are identified with a suffix of “-*n*” where *n* is the number of the marriage; for example, 1.2.3-1 is the first spouse of 1.2.3.

Key dates are specified in MM-DD-CCYY format with abbreviations:

Mother: Judith Le SCHELLEUR b. 11-2-1777; m. 10-27-1798 Jersey; d. 7-30-1807 St. Helier, Jersey.  Immigrated to Nova Scotia with 3 siblings. Youngest sister, Ann, born 1816 Arichat. This date is all I have to bracket their arrival date.  Did not appear in either the 1811 or 1818 census of Cape Breton. Nor in the 1817 Guysborough census.  14 children:  George Wingate Dorey, b. 1830  Philip Dorey, b. 1832  Joshua David Dorey, b. 1835  Caroline Ann Dorey, b. 1836  Julia Tryphina Dorey, b. 1838  Moses Dorey, b. 1839  Elizabeth Dorey, b. 1843  John James Dorey, b. 1844  Andrew Dorey, b. 1848  Harriet Dorey, b. 1849  Andrew Cyrus Dorey, b. 1853  William Dorey, b. unknown  Chester Leete Dorey, b. unknown  Eunice Lucretia Louisa Jane Dorey, b. 1856  Cited in 1838 Guysborough census with wife and four children.  Bricklayer in 1852 when son Andrew Cyrus was born. He and his family were cited in the 1852 census of St. John's Anglican Church, which was the equivalent of a full nominal census of all non-Catholics on Isle Madame:  Philip (52), Margaret, Mrs (42), George Wingate (22), Philip (20), Joshua (18), Caroline (15), Julia? (13), Moses (11), Elizabeth (8), John (6), Harriet (3).  His middle name was given in the 1853 baptism of his son Andrew and the 1856 baptism record of his daughter Eunice Lucretia Louisa Jane Dorey.</p>

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			<p>Burial ceremony by R. F. Brine. His tombstone in the church cemetery is engraved: PHILIP DORÉ BORN 1799 DIED 1863 HATTIE FRANKLIN BORN 1849 DIED 1897 AT REST</p> <p>Hattie was believed by some to be his second wife, but I have found no evidence for this. I believe her to be daughter Harriet. Robert S. Latimer believes she was the wife of Philip's son Philip, but this man lived in California and as early as 1860 and died there unmarried in 1899. There is more discussion of her identity in the entry for Henriette Dorey.</p> <p>Another mystery is why Philip's early children were baptized in an Anglican church (the last in 1843) and the later children were baptized in a Catholic church (beginning in 1845).</p>

English ancestry.            Mother: Mary MacPHERSON b. abt. 1873 NY, m. 12-7-1800 Guysborough Intervale, d. 5-28-1875 Guysborough Intervale. Her half-sister Margaret married Andrew's brother Jabez in a double wedding. She was the daughter of James McPHERSON and Mary, he was a British soldier who fought (and likely died) in the Revolutionary War.            Margaret was a descendant of William Leete (1612–1683), a governor of Connecticut, and thus of William I the Lion, King of Scotland (1142–1214).            Margaret's last child was named Eunice Lucretia Louisa Jane Dorey, I suspect the child was named after two aunts: Eunice and Lucretia Leet. I don't know where Louisa came from.</p> <p>In summer 1786 Margaret's grandfather Andrew Leete</p>

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			<p>moved his wife and six children from CT to Guysborough, Nova Scotia. He was one of the 18 original settlers of the Hallowell Grant. (In 1765 Benjamin Hallowell, Sr., Comptroller of the Port of Boston, received a grant of 20,000 acres on Chedabucto Harbor in what is now Guysborough County. At the end of the American Revolution, lands were granted to soldiers of disbanded regiments and to settlers from former American colonies who had remained loyal to the British crown.)</p> <p>Margaret's father was born with his surname spelled Leete, the final "e" was dropped when the family moved to Nova Scotia. Margaret, born in NS, was named Leet.</p> <p>Grandfather Andrew settled on 150 acres in Guysborough Intervale on the banks of the Milford Haven River.</p> <p>In 1871 Margaret lived with son Andrew Cyrus in Arichat. Death is believed to be about 1875. No burial record found.</p>

Five children.  A 2005 email from Bob Dunphy saidd that George and Jane had adopted two children which were named in their will: Elizabeth MacPherson and William MacPherson.  In 1881 lived in Petit de Grat with wife Jane (49), children Henry (20) and Sophia (18), and one servant; he was mason, all belonged to Church of England.  A 2005 email from Bob Dunphy stated that Wingate and Jane had adopted two children, each mentioned in Wingate's will: Elizabeth MacPherson and William MacPherson.</p>

Her name appears on son William Henry Dore's memorial in France; he died in 1918. She may have been living in Burlingame then, per the memorial. In 1920 lived in San Francisco, CA. In 1927 lived in San Mateo, CA per newspaper article in San Mateo Times 7-25-1927 which described her trip to Moose Jaw to visit daughter Sophia. In 1928 she (Jennie C. Dore) filed a deed with San Mateo County to transfer land to John Harvard Dore and wife: lot 5 block 12 Burl Grove in Burlingame. John then sold it to Samuel Davis for \$3500. In 1930 lived in Burlingame, CA with son John Harvard and his wife Kathleen. Husband #2: Hans Bowman. They lived in Boulder Creek, CA. He appears in the 1910 census living in Coalinga, CA with wife Melinda C. and 2 step-children

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			<p>named Wiley. He was 48, she 54, second marriage for each. He was born in Denmark of Danish parents, she was born in Missouri to German-born father and Kentucky-born mother. She had 8 children, 7 living. He worked as a blacksmith, she as a washerwoman.</p> <p>He appears in the 1920 census living in owned home on Pine Street in Santa Cruz with wife Melinda C. He was 58, she 64. He was born in Denmark, immigrated in 1900, naturalized in 1905/1908. She was born in MO of parents born in IN. He was a section hand on a steam railroad. He appears in 1930 census living in an owned home on the same street in Santa Cruz; this time he's a 72-year old widower from Denmark who immigrated in 1891 and worked as a road contractor.</p> <p>The California Death Index has an entry for Hans Bowman, born 11-19-1859 in another country, died 4-8-1942 Santa Cruz.</p> <p>Her death certificate read "Jennette C. Bowman". She died at Mills Memorial Hospital, Burlingame, CA. "The principal cause of death and related causes of importance, in order of onset, were as follows: Cerebral Hemorrhage 1-8-40, Hypertension 1935, Chronic myocarditis 1938. Other contributory causes of importance: Pleural effusion 1939." That sounds like a stroke compounded by heart problems. She was buried in Colma, a town in San Mateo County just south of San Francisco that is mostly populated with dead people in 17 cemeteries.</p>

A city street in San Mateo, Dore Avenue, is named for his family. In 1930 lived with wife Kathleen, mother Janet, and son John Jr. in Burlingame, CA. Don't know who this son was, certainly not the one born 1940. Uncle Harve (as Barb Miller knew him) bought property in Redwood City (?) that was a farm with animals. He used to take John Jr. (the son born in 1940) there. John Jr. died there in an accident. After that John Harvard was dispirited. Lived at 1614 Forest View, Burlingame, CA at time of death, Died of cancer. Died with surname DORE. Three children.</p>

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			<p>8-2009: I could not find a marriage record for Kathleen in the Maine Vital Records.</p> <p>In 1930 her parents, two children, and 1 brother lived in Burlingame, CA at 119 Highland Avenue.</p> <p>In 1930 Kathleen lived in Burlingame on Lincoln Avenue with husband, mother-in-law, and one child: John Jr. age 5. This child is a mystery: if he is a child of Kathleen, then she was 16 when he was born. I can find no birth or death record for him.</p> <p>Obituary in "The Almanac," April 12, 2000: "Kathleen DORE. ... Before her final illness, she lived with her daughter, Kathleen Dore Lyons of Portola Valley, for 10 years. Mr. and Mrs. Dore helped found the San Mateo chapter of the Boys' Club of America in 1953 in memory of their son, John Harvard Dore Jr. The family gave four parcels of land on which the club was built. Former president of the United States Herbert Hoover attended the ground-breaking ceremony. The club is now known as the Midpeninsula Boys &amp; Girls Club. Mrs. Dore became a 25-year volunteer with the American Cancer Society after her husband died of cancer in 1963.... Survivors include her daughter, Kathleen Dore Lyons of Portola Valley, granddaughters, Lori Anne Zimmerman and Lynne Kathleen Carson of Burlingame; and two great-grandchildren...."</p>

Baptized as William Henry Wingard Dorey. Died a Captain in the Canadian Infantry (Saskatchewan Regiment) of the Royal Air Force in World War I. He died at Péronne, France (in Picardy on the Somme River); the effort was a part of the Reduction of Amiens Salient operation on the Western Front which was from August 8 to September 4, 1918. His family believes his body was not found. He is named at the Arras Flying Services Memorial in Pas de Calais, France; this memorial commemorates nearly 1,000 airmen who were killed on the whole Western Front and who have no known grave.</p> <p>On 8 August the Battle for Amiens (also known as the Third Battle of the Somme) commenced when a combined Australian, British and Canadian force attacked the Germans eastwards from Villers-Bretonneux. The offensive broke the German line so thoroughly that most of their field artillery was overrun and captured, their advance reversed. By the end of August 1918, the last German stronghold was located at Mont St Quentin, which overlooked the Somme River about 1.5 kilometers north of Péronne. This was attacked by the Australians, who then entered Péronne on September 2, 1918 after beginning their attack in the early morning of the day before. The War ended shortly thereafter.</p> <p>There is now in Péronne The Museum of the Great War. He was engaged, but not married, to an Englishwoman named Nora.</p>

Her baptism record makes her parentage clear. It is her father's tombstone that introduces the controversy: "PHILIP DORÉ BORN 1799 DIED 1863, HATTIE FRANKLIN BORN 1849 DIED 1897."  Who was Hattie and why was she named on the tombstone? Wife? Daughter?  First of all, Hattie is a common nickname for Harriet. Some researchers believe Hattie to have been a second wife of Philip's, but there is no evidence for this aside from the tombstone itself. I believe Hattie to be the daughter who was baptized as Henriette, which is why I report here that Harriet died in 1897.  Family genealogist Robert S. Latimer in his <i>Latimer Family History</i> states that "Philip married Hattie Franklin," Philip being #1.2. This was repeated in <i>Janvrin's Island, 200 Years to Celebrate</i>. That seems unlikely because Philip Dorey the son lived in California from at least 1860 until his death in 1899 as an unmarried man. Stay tuned.</p> <p>The 1897 burial record was transcribed as "Mrs. Franklin?" and cause of death as "Drowned while bathing near the house; as a good swimmer supposed to have taken a fit or cramps in the water." This record, aside from the troublesome question mark, suggests that Hattie was not Mrs. Dorey.</p>
